The **Exhibition** shows the ideas collected so far and explains how they can be developed into the Neighbourhood Development Plan which will then be available for public consultation later this year and then voted on in a referendum. The exhibition is manned and you are encouraged to leave your comments.

At the **Discussion Sessions** you are invited to sit in groups around tables. Each session starts with a short presentation and round table discussions follow on. There will be various opportunities to leave your comments, add your ideas and express your views.

“Where will the houses go and what they will be like?” sessions concentrate on the options for the siting of residential development, and possible design, landscaping and heritage issues.

“What can we do about things like Green issues, parking, schools, local businesses?” sessions concentrate on the issues of commercial development, employment, biodiversity, infrastructure, parking and flooding.
